

10 PRINCIPLES FOR PEACEFUL LIFE

- 1. Do Not Interfere In Others' Business Unless Asked: Most of us create our own problems by interfering too often in others' affairs. We do so because somehow we have convinced ourselves that our way is the best way, our logic is the perfect logic and those who do not conform to our thinking must be criticized and steered to the right direction, i.e. our direction. - 2. Forgive And Forget: This is the most powerful aid to peace of mind, but also challenging to achieve. We often develop ill feelings inside our heart for the person who insult us or harm us. We nurture grievances resulting in loss of sleep, development of stomach ulcers, and high blood pressure. We further aggravate stress in ourselves by remembering, and reminding ourselves of the very persons that caused us harm. Get over this bad habit. Life is too short to waste in such trifles. Forgive, forget, and march on. Love flourishes in giving and forgiving.
- 3. Do Not Crave For Recognition: This world is full of selfish people. They seldom praise anybody without selfish motives. They may praise you today because you are in power, but no sooner than you are powerless; they will forget your achievement and will start finding faults in you. Why do you wish to kill yourself in striving for their recognition? Do your duties ethically and sincerely, and only seek the pleasure of God through prayers.
- 4. Do Not Be Jealous: We all have experienced how jealousy can disturb our peace of mind. You know that you work harder than your colleagues in the office, but sometimes they get promotions; you do not. You started a business several years ago, but you are not as successful as your neighbour whose business is only a one year old. There are several examples like these in everyday life. Should you be jealous? No. Remember, a person's life is shaped by their destiny, which becomes their reality. If you are destined to be rich, nothing in the world can stop you. 





MALE INFERTILITY

ILL UNDERSTOOD, ILL ATTENDED, AND ILL MANAGED

Dr. Himanshu Bavishi

Male factor is responsible for almost 50% of the infertile couples. Hence it needs more serious consideration. Here are some useful recent concepts from European Association of Urology Guidelines 2007 and WHO. In a recent study of 7057 male infertility patients, 75.1% had IDIOPATHIC oligo astheno terato spermia (OAT).

While planning the treatment in male infertility other prognostic factors must be considered

- Duration of infertility
- Primary or secondary infertility
- Results of semen analysis
- Age and fertility status of the female partner.

When the duration of infertility exceeds 4 years, the conception rate per month is only 1.5%. The fertility of a woman of 35 years of age is only 50% of the fertility potential of a woman aged 25 years. By the age of 38 years, this has reduced to only 25% and over the age of 40 years it is less than 5%. Hence, early treatment is beneficial even in male factor infertility.

A clinical examination of male is mandatory to decide the line of treatment.

WHO criteria of standard values for semen analysis.

- Volume
- $> 2.0 \, \text{mL}$
- Sperm Concentration ≥ 20 million / mL
- Motility
- ≥ 50% with progressive motility 25% with rapid motility
- Morphology
- ≥ 14% of normal shape

AZOOSPERMIA - Non obstructive

Elevated FSH does not rule out presence of sperm, testicular biopsy is the best procedure to define the histological diagnosis and the possibility of finding sperm. When spermatozoa are detected, these can be cryospreserved for use in future ICSI cycles.

AZOOSPERMIA - Obstructive

Obstructive lesions of the seminal tract should be suspected in azoospermic or severely oligozoospermic patients with normal-sized testes and normal endocrine parameters.

Results of the reconstructive microsurgery depend on the cause and location of the obstruction and the expertise of the surgeon and equipments. Sperm retrieval techniques should simultaneously be applied with surgery.

These methods should only be performed with the facility for cryostorage of the tissue.

VARICOCELE

Classification for clinical practice

- Subclinical: Not palpable or visible but reflux on Doppler
- Grade 1: Palpable during valsalva manoeuvre only
- Grade 2: Palpable at rest, but not visible.
- Grade 3: Visible and palpable at rest.

Basic Considerations

- Present in 20-24% of the adult male population.
- Present in 25% of men with abnormal semen
- Its exact association with reduced male fertility is not known,

WHO data clearly indicates that varicocele is related to semen abnormalities, decreased testicular volume and decline in Leydig cell function.

Treatment

Best treatment is microsurgery through inguinal approach, gives best benefit with least complications and recurrence chance.

Varicocele treatment for infertility should not be done unless there has been full discussion with the infertile couple about the uncertainties of treatment benefit.

IDIOPATHIC MALE INFERTILITY RECOMMENDATIONS

- advised in Medical treatment can be hypogonadotrophic hypogonadism.
- Drugs are usually ineffective in idiopathic male infertility.

SEMEN CRYOPRESERVATION RECOMMENDATIONS

- Cryopreservation of semen should be offered to all men BEFORE chemotherapy, radiation or surgical interventions that might interfere with spermatogenesis or cause ejaculatory disorders.
- When testicular biopsies are performed, sperm cryopreservation as part of the same procedure is strongly advised.
- If cryopreservation is not locally available, patient should be transferred to the nearest cryopreservation unit.
- Avoid transmission of viral, sexually transmitted infection from donor to recipient.
- Samples of HbsAg or HIV +ve men should be stored in separate containers.
